- 5. Montana has two main geographic areas. Find out what they are and what each area produces. How do these resources help Montana's economy?

6. Famous Firsts:

Research one of these firsts or find another "first" for Montana, and share it with others. If possible, plan to visit one of the sites with your troop, group, or family.

- A. First fossil of baby dinosaurs and dinosaurs eggs found near Choteau
- B. First largest freshwater lake west of the Mississippi River Flathead Lake
- C. First and oldest National Park in the world Yellowstone National Park
- D. One of the first wildlife refuges in the nation National Bison Range
- E. First Underground shopping mall in the western United States Havre
- F. First permanent European settlement in Montana St. Mary's Mission in Stevensville
- 7. Montana is bordered by another country, Canada. Find the points of entry from Montana and what requirements you need to enter and return to each country.
- 8. Montana has seven Native American reservations. Label them on a map of Montana. Find out which tribes or nations live on each. If possible, plan to visit a reservation in your area or attend an event.
- 9. Map Lewis and Clark's expedition through Montana. Label the dates of stopping points along their journey.
- 10. There are many important people in Montana history. Research a historic/famous Montanan with your troop, group, or family. Share what you have learned with others. Examples: Marcus Daly, Mike Mansfield, Jeannette Rankin, Charles M. Russell, Dolly Smith Cusker Akers, Dana Carvey, Evil Knievel, and many more...
- 11. Montana has 48 state parks. Find which parks are close to where you live. What do you think makes these parks special? If possible, enjoy an afternoon experiencing one of these parks, or plan to experience the park, with your troop, group, or, family. Were you right about what makes the park special?
- 12. **Digging in Montana.** This state is famous for gems, gold, fossils, minerals, and many more underground finds. Find out about mining in Montana. If possible, try a mining or digging technique to find a treasure of your own.
- 13. Find five interesting facts about Montana and share them with your troop, group, or family.
