Girl Scout Traditions

Girl Scouts is rich with traditions like S'mores, the Girl Scout handshake and camp. Court of Awards and Bridging ceremonies are also part of Girl Scout traditions and both of these ceremonies are a great way to celebrate your Juliette's accomplishments.

Court of Awards is a ceremony held to recognize accomplishments in the form of badges, awards, pins, and patches and can be held throughout the year, your Juliette has worked hard and will be proud to display her new accomplishments on her uniform. There is no set way to hold a Court of Awards ceremony, let your Juliette be creative in planning her ceremony. She may want to include a candle lighting to reaffirm her Girl Scout Promise and Law, have a theme, hold it at her favorite park; the possibilities are endless!

Bridging celebrates the transition to the next Girl Scout age level and is a time for a Girl Scout to reflect on her accomplishments and get ready for new adventures. Each age level has its own bridging patch and girls can earn their Bridging Award to give them a taste of what is to come. There are 2 steps to earning the bridging award, at any age level. While at first glance these steps seem to be made for girls in a troop, they can easily done individually. I have also attached a Bridging Guide for you and your Juliette to use if she will be bridging this year.

- 1. **Pass it on!** Girls get a chance to look back at what they have accomplished and pass on a bit of knowledge to younger Girl Scouts. If your Juliette does not know a younger Girl Scout or have a younger sibling, she could create a poster or write something about what she would like to pass on.
- 2. Look Ahead! Meet with Girl Scouts at the level that they will be bridging to and learn about the exciting adventures that lie ahead. To complete this step, your Juliette could look at the Girl's Guide to Girl Scouting for the next age level and learn about a badge she could earn or write a wish list of things she would like to do at the next Girl Scout age level.

Girl Scout 110th Anniversary Celebrations

Helena, MT July 9-10, 2022 - Festivities begin Friday afternoon with the Highest Awards Ceremony at the State Capital, followed by a tour. Check-in begins for the 110th Celebration Friday evening at 5:00pm (you're welcome to join us Saturday if you prefer) and participants will have dinner, set up their tents for the weekend (plan to bring your own camping equipment!), and enjoy a movie. Saturday morning, participants will have a selection of field trips to choose from including hiking, fishing, canoeing, gold panning, mining for sapphires, and more (*girls will need to have their own adult transportation to attend the field trips*)! The afternoon will include a variety of self-paced stations followed by a carnival and classic Girl Scout Campfire. All registered participants will receive a commemorative 110th anniversary patch! Registration is now open for this event and you can request to use Juliette Funds to cover the registration fee.

Juliette Gordon Low Corner

Juliette Gordon Low is the founder of Girl Scouts and the namesake for Daisy Girl Scouts and Juliettes. In every edition I will give you tidbits about her and her life so you and your Juliette can learn more about her.

Girl Scouts was not the first organization that she founded, when Juliette Gordon Low was 16 she started the Helpful Hands club with cousins to sew clothing for an immigrant family. The club disbanded in 1876 with the yellow fever epidemic in Savannah, GA.
