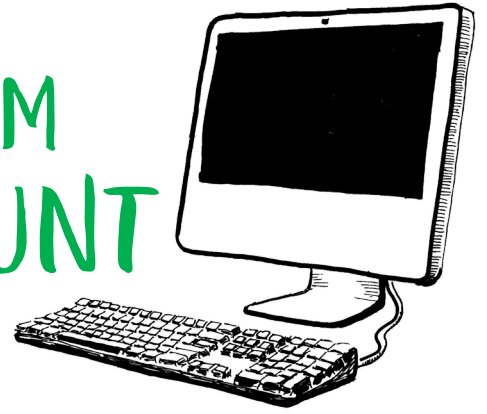




VIRTUAL MUSEUM SCAVENGER HUNT

Welcome to the Rijksmuseum! Before we get started on our Scavenger Hunt, here is a bit of history about the museum. The Rijksmuseum is in Amsterdam, Netherlands. The museum is dedicated to art and history. Originally, it was built in the Hague in 1798, but moved to Amsterdam in 1808. The Rijksmuseum was built by Pierre Cuypers and it officially opened in 1885. It has 8,000 objects of art and history displayed. It is home to over 1 million objects from the years 1200-2000.

Here are some other fun facts about the museum:

- It is formally known as the Royal Museum, the name was given by Louis Bonaparte, Napoleon Bonaparte's brother.
- The Rijksmuseum has a road that runs through it.
- It was built on top of more than 8,000 wooden piles.
- The Museum has the largest Library in the Netherlands.
- The museum has 80 galleries.

4. Find the painting called “Floral Still Life”. How many people are in the painting to the right of this one?



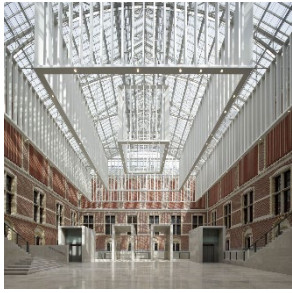
5. Find the painting called “Girl in White Kimono”. What season is it in the painting to the left of this one?
