Account Closures

Final Reminder. End of Year Financials were due June 30th. If you have not turned in your report yet, your troop or service unit bank account is at risk of closure.

Clover Go Changes

Starting with the 2025 Fall Product Program, GSMW is streamlining credit card payment options and will no longer support third-party vendors for troop transactions.

Troops currently using Clover Go can continue to do so through December 2025, as long as no changes are needed.

After December 2025, GSMW will be focusing exclusively on supporting Digital Cookie for credit card payments for cookies, ensuring a smooth and secure transaction experience.

While Clover Go accounts will no longer be hosted by GSMW after January 2026, we're here to help ensure a seamless transition and continued success with Digital Cookie.

Troops choosing to use a third-party credit card vendor beginning January 2026 will be responsible for any associated fees.



To make a lasting difference, Olivia partnered with teachers, school counselors, and the Child Development Center to create a user-friendly website with resources on classroom management, sensory needs, communication, and IEPs/504s.

Her site helps educators and caregivers better understand and support autistic children, ensuring they feel seen, included, and set up for success.

To further spread awareness, Olivia also designed and distributed fidget toys with a QR code that linked directly to her website. Thanks to her creativity and commitment, more children will get the support they need both in and out of the classroom.


Retail: Body Appreciation Badges
