GSMW has established Money Earning Guidelines for all troops, groups, service units, and Juliettes. ### Day Camp Director Preparation

'Tis the season to start thinking about your volunteer-run summer day camps! Do you want to help our Girl Scouts become better people by hosting a Day Camp in your community? If you want to volunteer as an esteemed Day Camp Director, your contribution is very important - the girls will look up to you as a role model, teacher, and friend. Visit <u>GSMW's Volunteer-Run Day Camp</u> web page for information regarding policies and procedures to ensure your day camp is insured and safe!

To provide Day Camp Directors with support, GSMW requires our Day Camp Directors to complete three important steps:

- 1. Download and review the <u>Day Camp Director's Manual</u>. The manual holds policies and procedures for every Day Camp Director.
- 2. Take the online Day Camp Director Questionnaire. The questionnaire is meant to familiarize directors with the manual content. It is not a test. Day Camp Directors and Co-Directors should complete the online questionnaire every three years.
- 3. After you complete the questionnaire, a GSMW representative will contact you to confirm your completion and to help you prepare for your Day Camp. Once your day camp plans are solidified, GSMW will require an online Day Camp Intent form meant to help your camp meet GSMW's insurance standards.

### Patch in a Package

From January through March 15th, GSMW will be offering a Patch in a Package program featuring our council's own American Sign Language (ASL) patch!

### What you need to know:

- You will be receiving orders through March 15<sup>th</sup> and they will be fulfilled twice monthly.
- Price: \$25 for in-council members and \$30 for out-of-council members.

### What your girl can expect:

- To learn basic American Sign Language, study careers in the ASL field, and more!
- Patch in a Package will expose your girls to important life skills—all on their own schedule.
- Each package will contain everything girls will need to earn their patch.

### Scholarship Opportunities

GSMW offers college scholarships that Girl Scouts can apply for. We provide links to other scholarship resources, so be sure to check out our College Scholarship page on the website!

### Upcoming opportunities include:

(The Deadline to apply for GS scholarships is April  $15^{th}$ )

- Herb Waltermire Cascade County \$2,500 This scholarship is available to Girl Scouts who reside in Cascade County and who are working on (or received) their Gold Award. Must demonstrate strong community service, leadership, and have a 2.75 GPA or higher.
- University of Wyoming up to \$1000 This scholarship is available to Girl Scouts who are enrolled at the University of Wyoming (high school seniors or college students may apply). Applicant must submit three letters of reference (one from an adult active in Girl Scouts), have demonstrated leadership and community service, and have a 2.75 GPA or higher.
- Lucie P. Osburn \$250 High school senior Girl Scouts or college students may apply for this leadership scholarship. Must demonstrate leadership and have community service experience. Three letters of reference (one from an adult active in Girl Scouts) and a 2.75 GPA or higher is required.
- Nancy Fifer \$300 High school senior Girl Scouts whose field of study is of a financial interest (Banking, Business Administration with emphasis on finance, etc.) are encouraged to apply. Three letters of reference are required, one of which must be from someone in the banking/finance industry.

Congratulations to Opal B. of Kalispell, MT on earning her Girl Scout Gold Award by working to increase inclusion of people with disabilities in mainstream society, particularly in social settings. Opal did this by creating and hosting a webinar that focused on different types of abilities, including ADHD, Cerebral Palsy, Autism Spectrum Disorder, and Down Syndrome. The webinar was recorded and posted on YouTube and social media to increase its reach. Opal also worked to start a Buddy Program with her school's National Honors Society to promote inclusion and she has plans to continue to get the program off the ground and established outside of her Gold Award project.

## Girl Scouts' Virtual Viewing of the Big Sky Documentary Film Festival: February 17<sup>th</sup> - March 3<sup>rd</sup>

The Big Sky Documentary Film Festival (BSDFF) has invited all Girl Scouts of Montana and Wyoming to special virtual access to their school-age appropriate documentary films, otherwise known as Schoolhouse Docs. The films have been rated for students by local educators and offer a variety of age-appropriate and perspective-widening themes, bringing non-fiction film to the next generation. This online program provides family fun and educational opportunity to a wide range of audience members, introducing young people to global stories and the filmmakers that bring them to light. Viewing the global stories, too, could be a great edition to your girl's and troop's World Thinking Day experience!

Registration will open in late January for exclusive access to a number of short and long-format films that will show online from February 17<sup>th</sup> through March 3<sup>rd</sup>. Households will purchase a \$5.00 film ticket to view a handful of documentary films in their own homes!
