What the Cookie Program Means for Girls:

- By selling cookies, Girl Scouts develop five essential skills goal setting, decision making, money management, people skills, and business ethics all of which help them succeed today and in the future.
- All of the revenue earned from cookie sales every penny after paying the baker stays with the local troops and council. Girls decide how to spend their troop cookie money. Every package of cookies sold provides invaluable experiences for Girl Scouts such as service projects, troop travel, and summer camp.
- This year's theme, "Unbox the Future", aims to remove social barriers that often keep girls boxed in.

Fun Facts:

- The Girl Scout Cookie Program is the largest girl-only, girl-led business in the world.
- Caramel DeLites and Thin Mints are generally the top two cookies in the USA. Thin Mints have been around since 1939, with the first known record of a chocolate mint cookie being called Cookie Mints!
- Famous Girl Scouts include Taylor Swift, Dolly Parton, Carrie Underwood, Sheryl Crow, Halle Berry, Reese Witherspoon, Dakota Fanning, Queen Latifah, Barbara Walters, Hillary and Chelsea Clinton.
- Girl Scouts have been selling cookies since 1917; just five years after Juliette Gordon Low founded the organization.
